


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ACHIMOTA SCHOOL AT 100: LEGACY WORTH CELEBRATING WITH THE REVIVAL OF THE SCHOOL FARM

As Achimota School approaches its centenary in 2027, we recognize its founding as a major milestone in Ghana's history—one that deserves a national celebration. Beyond the friendly rivalries between secondary schools in Ghana, we acknowledge that unity in diversity strengthens our nation, with each institution contributing its unique values and heritage.

Achimota's story is deeply connected to the broader history of education in Africa. At the dawn of the 20th century, the Phelps Stokes Committee in the United States conducted extensive research on Black education.

Their work, which included visits to East, Central, and West Africa, resulted in the landmark 1920 Phelps Stokes Report. One of Achimota's founders, Dr. James Kwegyir Aggrey, was a key member of this Committee.

By this time, it had become increasingly expensive to bring British personnel to administer the Gold Coast. There was a pressing need to develop local expertise. However, the existing education system—introduced as early as the 17th century—was largely designed for evangelization and assisting European traders.





It was inadequate for the evolving needs of the colony. Recognizing this gap, Governor Sir Gordon Guggisberg established a committee of both African and European members to review the Phelps Stokes Report and chart a new course for education in the Gold Coast.

Two key principles emerged from this effort:1. Education must emphasize character building.2. Students must remain deeply connected to their African cultural heritage.

At the time, there was no formal curriculum for character building beyond routine tasks meant to instill discipline. Boarding schools were identified as the best way to provide the necessary structure for character development. Additionally, the idea of a coeducational institution—uncommon at the time—was integral to the early discussions.

On January 28, 1927, Achimota School was established, marking the beginning of a new educational policy for the Gold Coast. The institution was designed not just as a secondary school but as a comprehensive system, incorporating teacher training and primary education to ensure a steady pipeline of wellprepared students.

Achimota became the crucible for national development, shaping the manpower needs of the Gold Coast. From its foundations emerged Ghana's premier institutions of higher learning, including:

- University of Ghana, Legon
- Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), Kumasi
- University of Education, Winneba
- Teacher and nursing training colleges

Practical education was central to Achimota's vision. The School emphasized arts and crafts such as woodworking, ceramics, and weaving—as well as crop and livestock farming.

As Achimota nears its 100th anniversary, it is crucial that we reflect on the founding vision, particularly the focus on character building and cultural appreciation—values that remain relevant to Ghana's national development today.

Preserving Our Legacy: A Call to Action

The elaborate sewage treatment system that provided manure for agriculture is no more. The lands that once supported these initiatives have been encroached upon. While we celebrate our achievements, we must also acknowledge challenges. It is disappointing that the School Farm, once an integral part of Achimota's selfsustaining model, no longer exists.

Restoring the school farm would not only be a tribute to the founders' vision but also address modern challenges such as school feeding. More importantly, it would provide students with hands-on agricultural training, equipping them with skills essential for national development.

To support this initiative, the Old Achimotan Association (OAA) is launching a Centenary Raffle. We call upon the entire Achimotan Community and the public at large to actively participate. This is more than just a fundraiser—it is an opportunity to revive a crucial part of Achimota's legacy and ensure that future generations benefit from the School's founding principles.

Together, let us leave a legacy we can all be proud of.












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
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ACHIMOTA SCHOOL FARM - INTEGRATED CROP PRODUCTION PROPOSAL

Achimota School is committed to providing a well-rounded education that extends beyond the classroom. In alignment with this vision, the proposed 25-acre farm will serve as a living laboratory for sustainable agriculture, practical learning, and community engagement. The diversified farm will integrate open-field vegetable production under irrigation, dedicated greenhouses for high-value vegetables. This project is envisioned to enhance food security, innovative research in agronomic foster practices, and offer hands-on agricultural training for students and local community members.

The objectives of establishing the farm are as follows:

- Diversified Crop Production: Establish a 25acre integrated farm comprising 19.5 acres of open-field vegetable production and 5 acres of maize production under irrigation, 0.5 acre of greenhouse cultivation for high-value vegetables
- Educational Enhancement: Create practical learning environment that provides Achimota School students with hands-on experience in modern agricultural practices,



including irrigation management, greenhouse operations, and integrated crop management.

- Sustainable Farming Model: Develop a sustainable production system that serves as a demonstration model for diversified farming, emphasizing efficient resource utilization, environmental stewardship, and resilience in crop production.
- Community Engagement and Revenue **Generation**: Enhance local food security and opportunities for community provide involvement by producing surplus crops for local markets, thereby generating potential revenue that can support further educational and agricultural development initiatives.

The 25-acre field will be divided as follows:

- Maize cultivation (5 acres irrigated): This will be taken up by the School for feeding purposes.
- Open-Field Vegetable Production (15 acres) **irrigated)**: Suitable vegetables include tomatoes, onions, cowpeas, chili peppers, half of which will be taken up by the School as well as garden eggs, okras, ginger and lettuce selected based on market

Irrigation demand. will ensure year-round production.

•Greenhouse Cultivation (0.5 acres): High-value crops like tomatoes, bell pepper and cucumbers will be grown under controlled conditions to maximize yield and quality.

•Habanero/Chilli peppers (4.5 acres): has a strong local and export demand.


